

SVP Response to Complaint by Laura Anderson dated October 18th, 2006

First off, we thank you for extending the time to respond to this complaint.

The following are responses to each of Anderson's points as outlined in her complaint:

- 1) The RED KSA Shirts that Anderson is referring to have been made readily available to all members of the society. They were distributed in large numbers throughout the month of September at different events and also at the KSA offices. No one has been denied access to them. And as such, resources of the Society that are made available to every member do not constitute using Society resources. Anderson is obviously mistaken in this regard.
- 2) The SVP denies such allegations. KSA Shirts were never given out as campaign material. There is nothing further we can say about this issue except to say that these so-called "witnesses" that Anderson refers to should be interviewed. The SVP has a strong suspicion that these individuals are linked to the CSK. Please confirm or deny this allegation.
- 3) At no time during the election was Aaron Takhar campaigning with the SVP. He was indeed within the proximity of the election booths, both SVP and CSK. In addition, Yasser Ahmad was also observing the election in the same neutral manner at the Richmond Campus. Both Takhar and Ahmad know very well that staff are not to campaign during the election. In fact, Takhar was photographed by CSK members, and even posed for the picture, knowing very well that he was doing nothing wrong except for walking by both party tables throughout the day. This allegation is lacking any credible evidence.
