Hi Steve

Thank you for your email and yes without a doubt your complaint is within the regulatory time line.

Unfortunately, although you express a number of concerns and suggestions in your allegations , I must deny your request for re-polling on the Campus Candidates.

Firstly, I must assure you that the policy was indeed to allow students from another campus to vote the campus ballot of their home campus or the campus where they took most of their courses.

My partner and I personally handled the polling station at Surrey and Richmond and in both cases handled a few ballots for other campuses at the request of the student.

The process used was as follows:

If the students Id number was located on a campus list other than where he/she was voting, the question was asked where does he/she take most of her courses and if the answer was different from the polling station location, the student was asked whether he/she would like to vote on that campus. If so they were provided with a ballot from their preferred campus and that ballot was placed in an envelope addressed to that campus.

In questioning the polling clerks that looked after Langley and Cloverdale Campus who were trained by me personally and also worked as D.R.O.s during the October General Election; they emphatically stated that there were no such situations in Langley or in Cloverdale. In both cases they had in their possession ballots for each of the other campuses to be used should a voter request same.

When questioned particularly about your incident in Cloverdale, both Clerks denied that you were refused the right to vote using a Surrey Ballot. Please do not misunderstand, no one suggested that your complaint is untrue. It appears that there was a communication problem and for some reason the clerks did not understand what you were requesting.

I would also draw to your attention that you were the only voter at Cloverdale and therefore it is a fact that if you had been given a Surrey Ballot to vote, as a result of the spread of votes between the Candidates it would not have made a difference in the outcome of the election.

I do agree that in future elections, more publicity of voters voting at or for the correct campus should be utilized.
